Clare Barron is a playwright and performer from Wenatchee, Washington. Her play DANCE NATION recently received its world premiere at Playwrights Horizons in May 2018 and subsequently its UK premiere at the Almeida Theatre

in London. It is the recipient of the Susan Smith Blackburn Prize and The Relentless Award established in honor of Philip Seymour Hoffman. Other plays include: YOU GOT OLDER (Page 73; Steppenwolf) which received an Obie Award, Drama Desk nomination for Outstanding Play, and was a Susan Smith Blackburn finalist; I'LL NEVER LOVE AGAIN (The Bushwick Starr); and BABY SCREAMS MIRACLE (Clubbed Thumb; Woolly Mammoth). She is the recipient of a Whiting Award for Drama, the Paula Vogel Playwriting Award at The Vineyard, and the Page 73 Fellowship; and is a member of New Dramatists.

EMMA VALENTE is a freelance director, dramaturg, lighting designer and occasional trouble maker. She is the Co Artistic director and Co CEO of feminist theatre company THE RABBLE.

Emma is the recipient of the Creators Fund grant from Creative Victoria, a Sidney Myer Fellow, a Curator at Large (performance) at The SUBSTATION and received a Life Time Achievement award for Technical Achievement from The Green Room Awards.

Emma has directed works that have been performed at Malthouse Theatre, Arts Emerson (Boston), Dublin Fringe Festival, Wuzhen Festival (China), Vitalstatistix, Arts House, St Martins, Melbourne International Arts Festival, Dark MOFO, Brisbane Festival, Belvoir Theatre, MTC, The Substation, Theatre Works, CarriageWorks and La Mama.

Emma has been the dramaturg for artists including Nicola Gunn, Wang Chong, Liv Satchell, Eryn Jean Norvill Emma McManus, Rachel Perks, Alison Croggon, Angus Cerini, Zoey Dawson, Bridget Mackey, Daniel Schlusser, Andrea James, Elise Hearst and Meg Wilson. Emma's essay on Dramaturgy and Silence was published by the centre for Dramaturgy and Curation.

Emma is also an award-winning Lighting Design and has worked for many major theatre companies across the country.

Noemie's practice engages with sites and histories where ecological crisis, queer culture and composting occur. Their work has taken place in theatres, galleries, alleyways, dinner parties and blanket forts and includes Mother of Compost (M1 Singapore Fringe Festival) and Democracy Repair Services (The Blue Room Theatre). The Lion Never Sleeps was nominated for 4 Performing Arts WA awards and was named in Australian Book Review's 'Arts Highlights of 2019'. They were the winner of the 2020 Venie Holmgren Environmental Poetry Prize & 2021 West Australian Young Environmentalist of the Year

As a dramaturg & performance-maker, they have worked with Mammalian Diving Reflex, Perth Institute of Contemporary Arts, DADAA, Theatreworks She Writes program, La Mama Victorian Seniors Festival and with playwrights, dancers & performance artists across Boorloo (perth) and Naarm making/thinking a lot about process, ethics and ecosystem thinking in performance. They were the Creative Coordinator of 2022 KickstART Festival Youth Week WA at Propel Youth Arts WA and regularly speak and write about the intersection of art & climate justice.

SHHHH DRAMATURGS NOTES

Dear Audience.

Thank you for coming to experience this strange and wonderful world of *Shhhh*; for bringing your own vulnerable, complex and generous bodies full of stories and memories to these flawed characters. This play is so much about our fragile bodies and attempting to navigate what is it to be and have a fleshy, awkward, confusing body amidst this capitalist hellscape and the patriarchal conditioning of our society. Sometimes your body doesn't behave the way you expect it or want it to; it's unruly, messy, smelly, overflowing the bounds of polite conversation. Sometimes two bodies meeting each other breaks some fundamental trust or respect, and we are left wounded and traumatised (physically, emotionally, psychically). And sometimes, two or more bodies meeting each other with open-ness, compassion, a willingness to admit your mistakes, can be a profound, deeply revelatory and pleasurable encounter.

This play sits within and around these tensions and challenges. Six characters in the midst of figuring out, realising, processing and coming to terms with moments where they have had their consent and agency ignored, rejected or received, or done so to someone else. What it is to ask and be listened to. To have your desires heard and respected. And through all of this, there is tenderness, humour, radical intimacy, pizza, magic, potions and maybe some healing.


It has been so inspiring to witness the care and generosity of this entire team and the possibilities for what safer and braver rehearsal spaces might look and feel like. Throughout this process, we have had many conversations about how trauma manifests in the body, what affirmative consent can be and our complex responsibilities to one another as ethical beings in the world. We've drawn on artists and advocates like Michaela Coel and Saxon Mullins, the activism of restorative justice and abolition, and so many people whose names we will never know, but whose labour and courage have undeniably helped to shift these conversations forward.

I hope that *Shhhh* opens up some of these questions for you, and can show us how we might hold and care for one another, to fumble with the words but keep trying anyway, to get better at asking questions.
