Playwright

HANSOL JUNG

Hansol Jung is a playwright from South Korea. Productions include *Wild Goose Dreams* (The Public Theater, La Jolla Playhouse), *Wolf Play* (NNPN Rolling Premiere: Artists Rep, Mixed Blood, Company One), *Cardboard Piano* (Hu-

mana Festival at ATL), *Among the Dead* (Ma-Yi Theatre), and *No More Sad Things* (Sideshow, Boise Contemporary).

Commissions from The Public Theater, La Jolla Playhouse, Seattle Repertory Theatre, National Theatre in UK, Playwrights Horizons, Artists Repertory Theater, Ma-Yi Theatre and Oregon Shakespeare Festival. Her work has been developed at Royal Court, New York Theatre Workshop, Hedgebrook, Berkeley Repertory, Sundance Theatre Lab, O'Neill Theater Center, and the Lark. Hansol is the recipient of the Hodder Fellowship, Whiting Award, Helen Merrill Award, Page 73 Fellowship, Lark's Rita Goldberg Fellowship, NYTW's 2050 Fellowship, MacDowell Artist Residency, and International Playwrights Residency at Royal Court.

She is a proud member of the Ma-Yi Writers Lab, NYTW's Usual Suspects, and The New Class of Kilroys. MFA: Yale.



Director

ISABELLA VADIVELOO

Isabella is a Melbourne based theatre maker and director. She has a strong interest in the development of new, form pushing and politically engaged performance. With both settler Australian and Tamil Sri Lankan heritage, Isabella prioritises

centring underrepresented stories, often working with physical and body focused practices. She also centres her practice around emotional safety and respect, cultivating a workspace carefully primed for risk taking.

This is Isabella's first work with Red Stitch. Recent directing credits include *Unsuckle* (La Mama Theatre), *Poona* (Next Wave Festival), *Cybec Electric* (Melbourne Theatre Company), *Atlantis* (Malthouse Theatre), and Assistant Director for *Sexual Misconduct of the Middle Classes* (Melbourne Theatre Company). She has worked with The Dig Collective, Teatro De Los Sentidos and the Australian Shakespeare Company. In 2020 she was the recipient of the La Mama Theatre Professional Development Grant. Isabella holds a Masters of Directing Live performance from the Victorian College of the Arts.

In 2018 he launched his theatre company, Hearth Theatre and produced, co-directed, and starred in *Danny and the Deep Blue*. In 2016, he performed in Malthouse's *Approximate Translation* directed by Felix Ching Ching Ho. In 2017, Yuchen performed in the leading role of Malthouse's *Little Emperors*, written by Lachlan Philpott and directed by Wang Chong. In 2018, he performed in Little Ones Theatre's *Nightingale and The Rose*. In 2019, Yuchen played the Translator in *Golden Shield* (MTC). In 2022, he performed in *Variations or Exit Music*, directed by Justin Nott and Cavemxn by Bronwen Coleman.

WOLF PLAY DIRECTORS NOTES

The genius of this play about family, love and connection is that to stage it, connection, collaboration, and care must sit at the heart of the process. Our team has become vaguely telepathic through making this work, the actors and designers anticipating each other and what I'm about to ask them before I have a chance to. We have been so lucky to have such an amazing team on this show, a cast that is so wholly committed to their characters, designers with bold and complex visions, production team across every tiny detail and consultants and coaches who live and breathe the expertise of what they do.

It has been so wonderful watching all these people, so excellent at their jobs, take such careful care of each other. More and more, both in the world of the play and the staging of it, it's clear that loving something deeply is not in itself enough, we need to move with care, build community and trust each other.

We are so excited to bring Red Stitch audiences into that sense of community, to extend our care and trust to you, in the same way you have extended it to us in attending *Wolf Play*. I hope that as we traverse this story that is messy, ambiguous and complicated, you can feel the care, as well as the love, shining through.
